### **Parking Reminder**

### **Bring to the Exam Room**

- 1) A valid photo ID
- 2) Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- 3) Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- 4) A watch (no beeping or alarm) in case the exam room does not have a clock that can be easily seen.
- 5) Kleenex and water bottle (stored under your desk).
- 6) Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities (extra batteries) if they are taking an AP Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. Go to the College Board's student site ([www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators](http://www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators)) for a list of approved graphing calculators.
- 7) A ruler or straightedge if they are taking an AP Physics Exam.

### **Do NOT Bring to the Exam Room**

- 1) Cell phones, digital cameras, personal digital assistants (PDAs), BlackBerry smartphones, Bluetooth-enabled devices, MP3 players, e-mail/messaging devices, or any other electronic or communication devices.
- 2) Portable listening or recording devices – even with headphones – or photographic equipment.
- 3) Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets or, for Chinese Language and Culture, and Japanese Language and Culture, on scratch paper provided by the proctor).
- 4) Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils.
- 5) Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
