Bring Your Own Technology (BYOT) Agreement
2015-2016

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Eau Gallie High School is expanding a pilot program during the 2015-2016 school year, where students may bring their own technology to school. The purpose of the pilot is to improve student achievement through the use of personal technology in the classroom. Their own technology may include laptops, smart phones, tablets, eReaders, iPads, iPods, or internet-capable media players. **This is voluntary; students are not required to bring their technology to school. Accommodations will be made for students to experience the lesson in the classroom.**

The following is a summary of Eau Gallie High School's plan of action:

- The pilot is limited to students assigned to a classroom with a participating teacher. Those teachers will specify when technology may be used in class based on the planned lesson or activity. This may include activities such as; research, writing papers, taking notes, creating presentations, taking polls, and more.
- Students may only use their technology when teachers specifically instruct them to. Student use of personal technology is limited to classrooms participating in the pilot; no exceptions.
- School rules concerning electronics will continue to be enforced in all areas of the school except classrooms of those teachers participating in the pilot.
- Students must have a Brevard Public Schools Acceptable Use Policy and a Cloud Collaboration form signed and on file with Eau Gallie High School.
- Students will be responsible for the safe-keeping of any technology brought to school. Eau Gallie High School will not be held accountable for lost or stolen devices.
- Students must arrive to school with fully charged devices and will not be permitted to charge their devices in any classroom or common area not affiliated with the BYOT pilot.
