Key Areas of Study

RELIGION

- * Learn prayers: The Sign of the Cross, The Lord's Prayer, The Hail Mary, The Glory Be, Prayer Before Meals, and Prayer After Meals
- * Participate in prayer (including weekly mass)
- * Understand that God loves us and wants us to love others
- * Understand that God created the universe
- * Understand that God gave us Jesus
- * Learn about feasts and liturgical seasons

READING

- * Demonstrate developmental understanding of concepts of print texts such as how to hold books, how to track print, and how to distinguish words from pictures and letters from words
- * Recognize sentences and begin to understand that sentences begin with capital letters and end with some type of punctuation
- * Identify letters and distinguish letter sounds
- * Demonstrate basic understanding of the sound-print code: words contain sounds that are represented by letters, and letters combine to make words
- * Identify 20 basic sight words
- * Recognize and produce rhyming words



WRITING

- * Write letters of the alphabet and begin to represent words with letters
- * Write expressively using drawings, letters, and words

LISTENING/SPEAKING/VIEWING

- * Discuss prior knowledge of topics, relate to text, and make predictions before reading
- * Sustain their attention for an age-appropriate length of time while reading or listening to books
- * Complete a two-step task based on oral instructions
- * Listen attentively to others
- * Express ideas clearly in oral speaking

MATHEMATICS

- * Count, compare, describe, and sort objects
- * Connect numerals to the quantities they represent
- * Identify, write, and order numerals 0-20
- * Model (act out or use objects) problem solving involving simple addition and subtraction situations
- * Recognize and name basic geometric shapes
- * Explore objects in terms of their measurements
- * Identify coins by name and value: penny, nickel, and dime
- * Follow a daily schedule to help develop the concept of time
- * Name the days of the week
- * Identify, extend, and create patterns AB, ABB, ABC
- * Understand comparative and positional terms: more than, less than, equal to, above, below, left, right, top, middle, bottom
- * Understand and create simple graphs



SCIENCE/HEALTH

- * Use the five senses to make observations about the physical world

- * Name and identify seasons
- * Make daily weather observations
- * List characteristics and life cycle of a bean plant and a painted lady butterfly
- * Demonstrate how to care for their nose and teeth
- * Name body parts
- * Learn about personal safety through the "Talking About Touching" program

SOCIAL STUDIES

- * Develop responsibility by completing assigned weekly jobs
- * Recognize that all people have needs and wants
- * Describe how each person is special and unique
- * Recognize and follow family and school rules
- * Describe resources in the community (e.g. police officer, firefighter, library, etc.)
- * Recognize national symbols and recite the Pledge of Allegiance
- * Learn about holidays

ART

- * Art is taught regularly, as well as incorporated into daily activities
